

Computer training centre for police opened

GUARDIAN NEWS BUREAU SHILLONG, AUG 17: The District Training Centre (IT) of the East Khasi Hills District Police was inaugurated by the Superintendent of Police (SCRB) DN Jyrwa at Police Reserve in the city here on Wednesday.

The District Training Centre is part of the Crime Criminal Tracking and Networking System (CCTNS) project sanctioned by the Home Ministry aiming at training the police personnel on computer ap-

plications including the CCTNS software and prepare them to handle the CCTNS project which will be set up shortly in all police stations and link police stations in the country.

The DTC at present has 10 computers including one server and is connected by LAN.

The first batch of police personnel will undergo the training starting from August 22 for a 20 hour training period over a span of one week.

The DTC endeavours to train all police personnel of this district to be computer-literate and ready to handle the CCTNS project.

SP East Khasi hills district M Kharkrang, Addl SP (Crime) and in charge of DCRB Vivek Syiem, in charge of DTC KB Chetri besides others delivered brief speeches on the importance of the CCTNS during the occasion.

The function was well attended by OCs and ICs of East Khasi hills district.

Training for cops in computer applications

SHILLONG: As part of the crime control tracking and networking system (CCTNS), a training centre (IT) of the East Khasi Hills district police was inaugurated by the Superintendent of police State Crime Records Bureau (SCRB) DN Jyrwa here on Thursday.

The project aims at training the police personnel of the state on computer applications including the CCTNS software. After the training, the project would be set up in all the police stations linking it with the police stations all over the country.

Speaking on the occasion, state police officials including SP(City) M Kharkrang, SP (Crime) Vivek Syiem deliberated at length the various benefits of the project.

The first batch of the police personnel will undergo training from August 22 for a 20 hour long training programme over a span of one week.

The State Government is planning to fully make the project functional by 2013. The CCTNS is a part of 'e' governance plan to improve facilities of collection, storage, retrieval, analysis, transfer and sharing of data and information between police stations, state headquarters and central police organisations.

Meghalaya police to join national crime network

Shillong, Aug. 17: Meghalaya police are gearing up for the Crime Criminal Tracking and Networking System (CCTNS) with the inauguration of a district training centre (information technology) at the Police Reserve here today.

Last year, the Centre released Rs 30 crore towards the CCTNS project for 14 states and Union Territories. Meghalaya was one of the states chosen for the purpose.

CCTNS, a 100 per cent centrally sponsored scheme, is the pet project of the Union ministry of home affairs and aims at modernising the police force.

The project is a compre-

hensive and integrated system for enhancing effective policing at all levels and especially at police stations through adoption of e-governance and creation of nationwide network infrastructure.

The CCTNS includes hardware, communication infrastructure and data centre, CCTNS application, digitisation of historical records and capacity building.

It will focus on modules like registration, investigation, and prosecution solutions; crime prevention solutions; reporting solutions; collaboration solutions; emergency response management solutions; citizen and external interfacing solutions; and traffic solutions.

Inaugurated by D.N. Jyrwa, superintendent of police (state crime records bureau), the centre will train police personnel on computer applications including the CCTNS software and prepare them to handle the project which will be set up at all police stations. The project will also link police stations across the country.

At present, the centre has 10 computers and one server. The first batch of police personnel will undergo training on August 22 for a 20-hour period over a span of a week. It also endeavours to train all police personnel of the East Khasi Hills district to be computer literate to enable them to handle the CCTNS project.
